SB 1440 Implementation and Oversight Committee Meeting, 8/27/12
(NOTES)

In Texas, students can start an Associate's Degree at a Community College, then complete at a four year. The four year then communicates back to Community College to confirm the degree; the four year can still also confirm the degree. This is called Reverse Transfer, and apparently is efficient in Texas.

Progress Report: Latest data in hand was from July. There was a process of closing TMC'S in the queue but it is assumed to be less than 50. 100% of Community Colleges now have 2 or more Transfer degrees. They are currently in the process of printing off all degrees in the system, 1440 and other. They will send them back to campuses to check for inaccuracies.

CSU TMC SIMILAR REVIEW: CSU's want to stay true to the 1440. They realize there is a little mismatch between their admissions structure and the 1440 structure. Applying to a campus works, but the process of admitted by major or by concentration needs a slight re-structuring to allow for that bump to be transferred. There are concerns in relation to the mismatching of major names, leading to a possible change in how the CSU system names some of their courses of study, or how they accept other titles of courses.

Workgroup reports

ICW REPORT:

TMC STATUS/NEW TMCs: Anthropology and Computer Science are almost done; Philosophy and Spanish are on the assembly line. With Spanish they are trying to set a precedent for other languages. Nursing and Engineering are continuing to work. They are working on documents regarding reciprocity between Community Colleges and CSU's regarding the Community College's decisions about degree offering. We talked about C-ID (Course Identification Numbering System) and recognizing that it is the backbone of SB 1440. The committee is trying to streamline the C-ID processes. They also talked about linking GIE status and C-ID processes. They are working on convening more TMCs. They want the C-ID descriptor to be made in advanced, so that the TMCs that come in will be identified by and match it.

ENROLLMENT TRACKING: UC TAG: explains TAG procedure, students apply whenever they please and show their grades. CC counselors verify the info, and the UC's have access to the data in their own portal. They are thinking about doing something similar, put a calendar, and communication ability for counselors etc... They are looking to borrow some things from the TAG to use in the CSU system. They are planning to get some resources from UC Davis, including: info, policy, and context. This system includes validating the degree maps, GE, and major classes. Erik Skinner notes that this could be a popular, potentially cheap way to become more efficient, and to increase standardization. For this to work to work everybody needs common resolve and a desire for standardization. Students can use the TAG planner without plans of transfer, and it creates and ED-plan that can be checked virtually.

The only Spring transfers CSUs will be taking this year, is SB 1440 students, says ken O'Donnell; Associate Dean, Office of the Chancellor, California State University. They are experimenting. They expect 3500

applicants, they have room for yield, but the yield may be higher. Accepting only SB 1440 students in the spring serves as an experiment for SB 1440 students in general, and is better than the alternative (accepting no spring transfers).

Work has been done with counselors all over the state to train them on SB 1440, and to train others on SB 1440 as well. UC is paying attention to SB 1440 as well. Statewide Counselors conference is coming up, statewide. There are UC counselor's conference Fresno, 2 California Community College conferences, and 5 High school conferences coming up.

Publicity, including posters, tear pads, and other info, will be sent to every Community College in the state. Ads are also going to be placed on the radio, including internet radio.

The transfer degree website is still under construction. This website includes search functions, comparisons, you can look for degrees, find campuses that offer such majors, etc... It is the same info as on Chancellors office page, but integrated with the CSU system.
