

Student Senate for California Community Colleges | Fall 2013 Resolutions Dispositions

Whereas, Student Senate for California Community Colleges Resolution 7.02 F07 directs the Student Senate for California Community Colleges (SSCCC) governing body to “educate and assist...colleges in successfully passing and implementing the student representation fee”;

Resolved, that the Student Senate for California Community Colleges governing body will direct timely review of Education Code §76060.5 as amended by AB 1358, in addition to review of California Community Colleges Chancellor’s Office Legal Opinions related to *SRF*, for the purpose of creating a new, publicly owned document, entitled “*Student Representation Fee: An Implementation Guide for Students*”; and

Resolved, that the Student Senate for California Community Colleges disseminate the “*Student Representation Fee: An Implementation Guide for Students*” to local senates before Fall 2014 General assembly, especially to those colleges without the Student Representation Fee, and make it available on its website.

18.02 | F13: Constitutional Models

Whereas, the SSCCC structure was chosen at a convention which occurred before 2006;

Whereas, the SSCCC has embarked on a radical restructuring and movement toward professionalism under the guidance of the Strategic Plan adopted by the General Assembly;

Whereas, the SSCCC General Assembly referred the Proposed SSCCC Constitution to the Council, and the Rules Committee has pursued solicitation of models for the Constitution in order to maximize the transparency and inclusivity of the Constitution revision process, but the only submission for a model for the Constitution of the SSCCC was entered by the Chair of the Rules Committee;

Resolved, that the Student Senate for California Community Colleges disseminate a notice for any interested parties to submit a model or models for the SSCCC Constitution, with a submission period that lasts at least two (2) months;

Resolved, that the Student Senate for California Community Colleges direct the Student Senate Council to hold at least one public forum to review the Proposed SSCCC Constitution; and

Resolved, that the Student Senate for California Community Colleges disseminate a poll which includes all potential SSCCC Constitution models approved by the Rules Committee through the listserv on the conclusion of the aforementioned submission period, and pursue drafting governing documents which reflect the model of the Constitution supported by the largest plurality of legitimate ASO Delegates; and

Resolved, that the Student Senate for California Community Colleges direct the Student Senate Council to submit a completed Proposed SSCCC Constitution for adoption at the Spring General Assembly.

Whereas, the Student Senate for California Community Colleges support the improvement of student access within the 112 California Community Colleges;

Whereas, students are not being given access to the support of Pregnancy & STD prevention materials or supplies;

Whereas, a portion of the student health fee should be allocated towards providing Pregnancy & STD prevention/screening tests;

Whereas, there are agencies throughout the State of California that provide free or low cost STD & Pregnancy prevention/testing and supplies;

Resolved, that the Student Senate for California Community Colleges support access to sexual health resources for the 2.4 million constituents they serve;

Resolved, that the Student Senate for California Community Colleges promotes the distribution of condoms, lubrication, and pregnancy testing at the health service centers that operate on the campuses of the 112 California Community Colleges;

Resolved, that the Student Senate for California Community Colleges also urge the 112 health service centers to provide free (or low cost) Pregnancy testing; and

Resolved, that the Student Senate for California Community Colleges assist the colleges to provide these free to low cost services to students.
