I previously worked for 10 years for an ambulance company. As well as with ELAC's Office of Outreach and Recruitment which allowed me to understand and help student needs.

At ELAC I have served as the Vice President of the Communications Club, Co-chair of the Economic Student Association and student benefits coordinator with the Society of Hispanic Professional Engineers (SHPE). In 2021, I helped coordinate a rally in solidarity with Asian American and AAPI communities. I have been gracious to have benefited from programs such as financial aid, EOPS and have participated with the Honors Program, Pathway to Law, Latina Completion and Transfer Academy, Summer Shakespeare workshop and in several transfer center activities.
